MR. GENTRY: Just to save another motion, if you are going to vote no, it means two-thirds.

THE CHAIRMAN: A vote aye is in favor of a three-fifths vote in all cases. I would assume a vote no is opposition to three-fifths and, hence, that you favor two-thirds. All those in favor of three-fifths, please signify by a show of hands. Contrary? Twelve to five. Is there any further discussion of the question of extraordinary votes?

MR. GENTRY: No.

MR. CLAGETT: What was the vote on uniformity, nine to eight and twelve to five?

THE CHAIRMAN: Yes. Let's move to a consideration of the Sixth Report of the Committee on Judiciary.

MR. MARTINEAU: Just as a matter of introduction, I would like to say this is not the Sixth Report of the Committee on the Judiciary because the Committee didn't see it before it was sent out as the Sixth Report. I haven't heard any disclaimers from the Committee, so maybe it now has become the report of the
