they have the same qualifications as now required 1 to occupy a seat in the House of Delegates with one 2 important exception. We saw no reason why there was 3 any compelling reason for barring a clergyman from 4 running and, if he is elected, from serving as a 5 delegate to the constitutional convention. Moreover, 6 we were aware that Dr. Bard's Committee dealing with 7 the proposals for the Legislative arm had arrived at 8 the same conclusion for membership in the House of 9

Delegates.

so we have recommended that this Commission recommend to the General Assembly that delegates to the 1967 constitutional convention be required to possess the same qualifications as now required to occupy a seat in the House of Delegates except that the clergymen bar would not be applicable.

In effect, our recommendation would mean that a delegate would have to be 21 years of age, have resided in Maryland at least three years, and the last year thereof in the district from which he runs, prior to the time of his election. I mean by district
