1 DR. BARD: Mr. Chairman, does the 2 pension vary in terms of the number of years? THE CHAIRMAN: Yes, it does. DR. BARD: Would it be possible for him to 5 receive an extremely small pension under the circumstances which were just stated because he had been in for such a short time and certainly it wouldn't be worthwhile for 8 him to take the pension and thus give up all of the possibilities in practicing law, et cetera. 10 MR. MARTINEAU: He only gives up the pension 11 during the time he is doing these things. 12 MRS. BOTHE: I propose a substitute in my 13 motion, which might answer Mr. Hargrove's suggestion. 14 That is, to substitute for the word retire the words former judge or some word which would take in anybody 15 16 as receiving a judgeship, pensioned by virtue of 17 judicial service. 18 THE CHAIRMAN: Are you ready for the 19 question? The question would arise on the motion to 20 amend this section so as to provide that no judge during ŽΪ his continuance in office shall engage in the practice
