of law, rum for elective office other than the judicial office he may then hold, et cetera, or take part in any partisan political campaign or receive, except as herein provided, any remuneration for his judicial service, and to provide that no retired or former judge shall receive a pension while engaging in the practice of law.

MR. SYKES: Pension for judicial service.

THE CHAIRMAN: Pension for his judicial service while engaging in the practice of law. Are you ready for the question? All those in favor signify by a show of hands.

MR. HARGROVE: Would you state that again?

THE CHAIRMAN: What we are saying is that
the only limitation on the retired or former judge is
that he shall not receive a pension while he engages in the
practice of law. A vote in favor of this motion would
permit the former judge to engage in all these other
activities and receive his pension also.

DR. BARD: I am against it.

THE CHAIRMAN: A vote age is a vote in favor
