2	MRS. BOTHE: Mr. Mitchell's vote was cast
3	under a misapprehension from the Chair.
4	THE CHAIRMAN: Why the misapprehension?
5	MRS. BOTHE: Because he was instructed a vote
6	no would enable him to propose a motion allowing any
7	retired judge to engage in all activities, whereas,
8	the fact is that no such motion would be entertainable.
9	THE CHAIRMAN: I guess that would be true
