BROOKS: There were also sessions at this particular convention in Boston dealing with the holding of a Constitutional Convention and again it was reiterated by those who participated in the Michigan as well as the Rhode Island Conventions that we would do well in proposing a sound set of rules before the Convention meets which they can survey and then adopt or change as they see fit because of their experiences with trying to write the rules after they assembled to begin the work of the Convention itself.

There were also sessions dealing with metropolitan government and problems in this area in strengthening the executive branch of the government. The Chairman probably will like to expand on some of these sessions as well as perhaps some of the private conversations with persons at this meeting.

We had an opportunity to talk to some of those persons who have been consultant to this group before. For instance, Dr. John Wheeler was in attendance, as well as persons we hope to also involve in a seminar on problems of regional and metropolitan government
