parties, to make it partisan but representative of all parties. Chairmanships of subcommittees are allotted on this basis and apparently each committee then goes about the task of creating its own staff and undertaking preparation of its own part of the document and report without a great deal of relation to the rest of the Commission. One of their procedures, commented on as being quite different from what we talked about, is the fact that many of their Commission meetings, one had the impression this was most of them, were not public meetings, that there was no effort to involve the public in the questions being considered by the Committees and by the Commission itself.

I had the impression that the Commission as a Commission is simply not functioning in a review of the reports of its subcommittees in the manner in which this Commission is functioning but rather is merely exercising a sort of loose general supervision over the work of the various Committees.

The whole subject of constitutional revision was decided important enough by the persons working out
