the program for the Municipal League that they had one of the morning sessions and one of the afternoon sessions, work shop sessions, devoted entirely to this subject so that there was a full day of discussion of the whole matter of constitutional revision and procedures for it.

Some feeling that what we are attempting, even in drafting a Constitution, is a complete exercise in futility, that it accomplishes nothing, and could even do harm, but I must say that the predominant, very greatly predominant, view was that the possibility of a convention being able to accomplish anything without very extensive preparatory work by some group was very evident, I would say certainly nine out of ten or perhaps even a higher proportion of those participating in the discussion indicated very strong views.

I think the same could be said of the notion that the Convention should be an elected body. A great diversity of opinion as to how it should be elected as to whether it should be partisen or nonpartiser as to whother there should be collaite attempts nade
