Commission, the supplementary material we would have available, and in general give the new delegates a better insight into the problems facing them, so that they would then be able to tackle the task of studying the reports and various other matters and extensive bibliography with a great deal more gusto and certainly with a better chance of getting something out of it.

As you know, the Legislature recently installed a sort of school for new members of the Legislature. The Judiciary has adopted a similar system. We find now both on a national level and on a state level schools in effect for new Judges to acquaint them with the problems of judging.

What we are suggesting in effect is somewhat the same sort of procedure.

We have tried out the idea on several people and the response has been one to encourage rather than discourage. The Governor thought, for instance, that the Legislature would be very interested in providing for this type of thing. This, of course, is one of the problems that we will have to work out
