York Monday morning. I could be here in the afternoon.

MRS. FREEDLANDER: I can't make it.

THE CHAIRMAN: Out completely for you?

MRS. FREEDLANDER: Yes.

MR. CASE: I think, I don't want to get into this now, but it seems to me a big area and the frame of reference this Commission has to adopt is unresolved. I have been doing what I can to get it resolved with Judge Adkins, as you well know. But he is not here today, not here yet. I have specific reference to the thing which we got, our Committee got into somewhat obliquely in the revenue picture, that is, the place of the comptroller in the State Covernment.

I rather take it that the Commission at an early time suggested that or recommended in effect that the office be removed from the Constitution as a constitutional office. I have some very grave second doubts about that and second thoughts. My Committee, I think, will probably not buy this recommendation for very cogent reasons which I am not going into now.
