Chairman, because this is a question that I think is

very important and one which the Adkins Committee and

mine ought to meet and try to get resolved before

bringing back a report to the Commission. Certainly the

way it stands now it is very inconclusive and very

unsatisfactory.

THE CHAIRMAN: This is one of the major matters that I want to resolve at this next meeting.

I was hoping there could be a joint meeting of the two Committees this week and present it next Monday. If that is too short a time, we will have to push the next meeting up because I do want to have that matter presented by the two Committees and resolved finally by the Commission at the next meeting whenever it is. Have you talked to Judge Adkins at all as to a possible date?

MR. CASE: No, of course he wasn't at the meeting the other day, as you know. I haven't been able to get him in Balthone. I guess if I went to Salisbury, I could get him.
