parts, one constitutional matters not subject to change by the Legislature but which are nevertheless of a not permanent character, and matters which are not only not permanent but should be subject to future modification by the Legislature.

Dale, one of the things we talked about before you came in is the necessity of having another meeting of your Committee and the Committee on State Finance just as soon as possible because we must have a final report by that Committee by the next meeting which we have just talked about having on Saturday, December 3, which would be the last.

It is also necessary to arrange to take some additional testimony by that Committee. Would you talk to Mr. Case without fail sometime today and see if we can get a date set up for the Committee meeting?

JUDGE ADKINS: Yes, sir.

THE CHAIRMAN: "I might suggest to both of you that in view of the lateness of the date, I have no doubt it is going to be impossible to get a date for the meeting at which every member of both
