practically positive is silent on this point.

THE CHAIRMAN: I would like to ask this question,
Judge Adkins. I share Mr. Case's concern about this.

It seems to me the only reason for not providing for

it in the Constitution would be some notion that there

ought to be flexibility. Is there any such view?

JUDGE ADKINS: No. I don't think that is a fair statement. I don't think it was a question of flexibility at all. I think we would be basically not unhappy to see the solution that is now before us. We simply felt that it was so mathematically improbable, that we didn't see the point in devoting a lot of space and time in the Constitution to it. I was not firmly of that opinion. I felt more as the Chairman suggested.
