7 MR. CASE: Five.

8 THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Sayre?

9 MR. SAYRE: I have a question here. Does that
10 mean if the county council should submit this question to
11 referendum, that the referendum could not be regarded as
12 an extraordinary vote?

13 THE CHAIRMAN: You mean as a substitution for an
14 extraordinary vote?

15 MR. SAYRE: As a substitution. This could very
16 well be the means of a bond issue.

17 MR. CASE: Well, it could be.

18 MR. SAYRE: It just seems too fuzzy, that I have
19 problems.

20 MR. CASE: Not any more fuzzy than it was with
21 the State.
