THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Clagett?

MR. CLAGETT: I don't think that's a very wellgrounded fear. My God, you can scare yourself to death, but that doesn't necessarily mean you justify doing so.

MR. CASE: But you are just as dead.

MR. CLAGETT: You are just as dead, that's true, but at the same time I would say it's a little foreign to the field of politics as we're dealing with it here and political science. Let me give the Committee's thinking because we wrestled with this at some length and we included consideration of the problem in our Third Report and the conclusion of the Committee was, just as Mr. Martineau has stated a little bit earlier, that contrary to the situation with reference to the General Assembly acting where there was no restraining power except through the Constitutional language, the counties acting here do have the restraining power of the General Assembly and if what you are proposing now is considered to be advisable,
