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as that.

THE CHAIRMAN: One slight correction. Not the same, but two of the limitations. There are many more limitations on the State.

MR. HOFF: We're just talking about --

THE CHAIRMAN: The two of them. Mr. Case, I am troubled by one thing that could possibly happen with reference to your suggestion and I wonder if you would consider a slight modification of your motion and that is a section that would authorize the charter of a county or the General Assembly by public general law to impose such limitations on county borrowing as might be deemed desirable, but not less than these two things.

In other words, I don't want to create the inference that there should be no other limitations than these two.

MR. CASE: This is certainly implicit in my amendment. That limitation is the motion, readily citable and an example of what you are talking about.

THE CHAIRMAN: Now, I sense that there may be a difference of opinion on the two points and I wonder if it
