where -- recalling Mr. Case's statement before that it was agreeable with him to put it in the finance article along with State restrictions and thinking that that's probably the best idea, we're not voting on where it's going. We're just voting on principle.

THE CHAIRMAN: I would say we're voting on the principle, but I don't believe it's the best place for it, because we're talking here about the powers of counties and I think it would be desirable to include it here.

MRS. BOTHE: Then we'd have to put another section in on regional governments and perhaps other parts.

It makes it rather cumbersome.

MR. CLAGETT: This is sure giving us problems.

THE CHAIRMAN: Let's leave that to be resolved by the Committee on Style, where it goes.

MR. SAYRE: Could I ask for a further explanation?

Is there any reason why this should not be in the Constitution, from someone I've not heard from? I'm trying to be assured that you are right and I think you are.

THE CHAIRMAN: Is there any further discussion?
