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that time without change, other than that the criteria must be one provided by law and we've done so here.

THE CHAIRMAN: Dr. Bard?

DR. BARD: What troubles me about upon other criteria, and then this matter, it shall be in effect at any one time, but the classification may be changed at any one time, it would be perfectly possible to change the specific criterion at any time you wanted to and in this you would ever be evolving classifications in terms of rationalization that might be required in order to fulfil an idea.

It seems to me that if you stick to population -THE CHAIRMAN: Dr. Bard, this question has been
discussed before and debated and resolved. So, you will
have to move for a reconsideration, if you want to discuss
it further.

DR. BARD: I realize that. I would like an explanation of, upon other criteria. Is there some kind of limitation there which the Committee had in mind? That's what troubles me.

THE CHAIRMAN: The Committee had a limitation
