MR. BROOKS: It could grant, but not withdraw.

THE CHAIRMAN: It could grant today and take
away tomorrow.

MR. BROOKS: But it's the withdrawal as separate from the granting that is important.

MR. SAYRE: I just wondered if there were any inconsistencies with the three county requirement here.

THE CHAIRMAN: As I understand it, the whole concept of this thing, the creation of a region is not dependent upon the classification of counties. A classification of counties is necessary to enact something less that a State-wide law by the Legislature.

MR. SAYRE: That answers my question.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Scanlan?

MR. SCANLAN: Dr. Bard has expressed some concern about the phrase, or upon other criteria provided by law. I assume that the phrase still means reasonable criteria. Our geographic areas -- classifications such as bordering the Chesapeake might be reasonable, but the classifications of two counties that had two vowels in its name would be unreasonable and would be limited by
