Section 4, and would be further limited by the equal protection clause of the Fourteenth Amendment. I assume this is implied.

MR. BROOKS: For practicality, the whole situation probably is an overriding check on the whole system.

MR. SCANLAN: Of course.

THE CHAIRMAN: The only purpose of classification is to have something less than a State-wide law.

Now, it doesn't make sense to have a classification to carry out that purpose and if by creating a purely arbitrary classification you have tied your hands, then the whole thing is going to fail. Dr. Jenkins?

DR. JENKINS: Mr. Chairman, I really must trust the General Assembly. They may have a classification based on average income in order to get at the welfare situation in the major cities. This would be a reasonable classification, but I think we have to trust the General Assembly on this, although there are members of the General Assembly who would propose something such as this.
