establish five classes under a classification system that completes the parallel with the regional structure. As a result, the General Assembly could enact legislation for any government, regardless of the classification.

In other words, you have left the door completely open, unless you consider both of these at the same time, for the General Assembly to legislate for the regions and you would have no so-called home rule for the regional governments.

THE CHAIRMAN: So that there would be no misunderstanding about it, let me state my understanding, that the action previously taken with respect to Section 11.02(b), and what is contemplated with the suggested motion making the change to 11.03(c) is that the General Assembly shall have the power to transfer to a region from the counties comprising the region any of the powers of the counties and transfer those powers back from the region to the counties from which it came.

It could not transfer the powers from county to region and then from region to state. It goes from county to region or back from region to county. Mr.Sayre?
