1 MR. SAYRE: Does this, if I understand you 2 correctly, this would mean if you have a rapid transit compact between two regional governments, that the state 3 has raised up from the county to the regional government, it could not take over the state function as a whole 5 state function itself? Is that what you're saying? 6 7 THE CHAIRMAN: No, I don't think that is what 8 I am saying. It could take over anything ... a state 9 function. What we are talking about is the power to 10 take over local legislation, either local for a county 11 or local for a region. 12 MR. BROOKS: By general law, it can make any 13 of these things a state function. There is no restriction 14 on that. 15 MR. CLAGETT: But it would have to be a general 16 law only. 17 MR. BROOKS: That's right. 18 THE CHAIRMAN: Dr. Burdette? 19 DR. BURDETTE: Wouldn't it be useful to get 20 at some stage, to make John Brooks' point, some such clause 21 in the Constitution, but in no case shall the Legislature
