otherwise specifically authorized in this Constitution, the General Assembly may enact.

DR. WINSLOW: That would take care of both situations.

THE CHAIRMAN: Any further questions as to (c)? Let's move on to 11.04.

MR. CLAGETT: In 11.04, we're dealing with the structure of county governments and we provide in Subsection (a) that the General Assembly shall provide by law for methods and procedures by which the governing bodies of the counties or the voters of a non-charter county by petition may enact an instrument of government subject to referendum, and the General Assembly shall provide by law for an instrument of government for all non-charter counties, if they have failed to enact one for themselves, by January 1st, of the fourth year following the effective date of this Constitution.

We thus provide for the degree of flexibility for the county to adopt a charter or other instrument of government and we can think of no other instrument of government that wouldn't be a charter, but we have given
