provide the loophole --

MR. CLAGETT: Except as herein provided.

I think maybe we better put in general public law.

THE CHAIRMAN: Any objection?

MR. BROOKS: Where we say governing body in this section, do we mean legislating body again in conformity with prior sections?

MR. CLAGETT: Yes.

DR. BURDETTE: You want to put in public general

MR. CLAGETT: Here again, I think we are including here the acts of both the executive and the legislative and by governing body we say that in the sense of meaning both the legislative and executive, and we don't say legislative body, as we did above. Therefore, it would include both, similar to the present Article XI(a).

MR. HAILE: Couldn't we put governmental bodies, which includes the singular and non-charter counties which also includes the singular?

MR. CLAGETT: I don't see any objection to that.

That's a matter of style.
