end of the four years, it takes whatever the Legislature provides. Is that what you are saying?

MR. CLAGETT: Right.

DR. BURDETTE: Now, what do we mean by charter?

If we mean by charter the construction set forth in the present 11(a), I don't see anything in this Constitution that requires that construction. Therefore, if you want to call it a charter, the difficulty right away is that it gives the idea that it has in 11(a). In other words, I was not in on the last discussion at the Committee which was somewhat informal at the Brown Estate, that the governing body had to be called a County Council, which is the provision under 11(a).

MR. BROOKS: It doesn't have to be called --

THE CHAIRMAN: I don't know that the term charter county carries all of the provisions of 11(a).

DR. BURDETTE: If they are synonymous, but then I revert immediately to Judge Adkins' point, if they are synonymous, why not use similar language.

THE CHAIRMAN: It seems to me, in the light of Mr. Clagett's last statement, in the fourth line, the word
