ought to be charter instead of instrument of government. 1 MR. CLAGETT: No, we don't want to do that. 2 We have been over that until hell has frozen over it. 3 MRS. BOTHE: Why? MR. CASE: He's going to tell you. Just give 5 him time. MR. CLAGETT: Let's not go back in to that one 7 because that is exactly what Mrs. Freedlander has been 8 asking and finally got the answer. 9 MR. SCANLAN: I think the Committee is causing 10 this mish-mash. If you mean charter, say that, or if you 11 mean code county, say that. Define the instrument, so we 12 know what you mean. 13 THE CHAIRMAN: What does the Committee intend 14 shall be done by the counties within the first four years? 15 MR. CLACETT: They shall exercise the broad 16 powers granted under this Constitution. 17 THE CHAIRMAN: I mean so far as adopting the 18 form of government is concerned. 19 MR. CLAGETT: And shall certainly direct them-20 selves toward adopting an instrument of government to 21
