MR. CLAGETT: That is correct. We do not believe that the county -- let's get this clear. We do not believe that the County Commissioner form of government, with the exercise of both legislative and executive power, can effectively operate in the best interest of the people and utilize the broad grant of power.

Number one, it could provide under the exercise of the broad grant of power that the next election of County Commissioners shall be 20 years from now and therefore the present County Commissioners shall stay in authority for the next 20 years; but they might be young men and might make it 40 years. Now, that is entirely possible, unless you have an instrument of government or a charter, and I'm using the words synonymously, now, which will provide for regular election, which will provide in other ways for the orderly operation of the government of the county.

We do not believe, and it's been a long fought battle, we do not believe that without a charter the broad grant of power can be as effectively utilized than with a charter and we are aiming now for the ultimate rather than
