MRS. BOTHE: Well, in your Prince George's

County where your people are so sore at the prospect of
a charter, suppose some person creates some instrument
of inadequate government within the four-year period ---

THE CHAIRMAN: It has to be adopted by the people.

MRS. BOTHE: The people don't want a charter.

MR. CLAGETT: They are going to get it, anyway. That's the point. There are only 37 charter counties in the entire United States. Four of those 37 are right here in Maryland. So, it hasn't been the most popular form of government. However, all authorities agree that it is the most effective structure of government where you are going to use such broad powers as we have provided here.

Now, it is in order to give those broad powers that we are going this additional step and it is a pretty difficult step to take. It is one that I think we are going to have difficulty enough in selling it, but I think it can be accomplished. The last vote in Prince George's County when the charter was defeated was a close one.

Before that it was a substantial majority. The movement
