This isn't the time now, Mr. Chairman.

THE CHAIRMAN: Any further comments on any part of Roman Numeral I of the fourth report? not. Part 2.

I would like to think about that.

JUDGE ADKINS: Part two has here tofore been presented to and approved by the Commission. It simply states that the Governor may inform the General Assembly of the conditions of the state and recommend measures he considers necessary or desirable.

MRS. FREEDLANDER: Mr. Chairman, I would like-I don't want to get involved in to speak to this. semantics, Mr. Chairman, but I think the phrase, of the conditions of the state, is not necessary.

It could be rephrased, the Governor may address the General Assembly and recommend measures, or something of that nature, because a Governor could inform the General Assembly of a declaration of war, which would not be a condition of the state but would be a condition of the nation. Rather than limit it, I would like it to
