1	General Assembly shall provide by public general law.
2	Shouldn't we say, at its first session after the adoption
3	of this Constitution, so that it will do it promptly?
4	It may delay the matter.
5	THE CHAIRMAN: Is there any necessity to make
6	them do it at the first session?
7	MR. HAILE: Unless they do it, I don't know
8	what procedure the Counties by public local law would
9	follow or the voters by petition. They wouldn't have
10	any procedure to follow.
11	THE CHAIRMan: You are talking about the
12	first sentence. I was thinking of the second sentence.
13	I think your point is well taken. Do you agree,
14	Mr. Clagett?
15	MR. CLAGETT: I think so. I think it adds a
16	degree of impetus to it.
17	THE CHAIRMAN: Then you would start the sen-
18	tence by the phruse, at its first session following

the adoption of this Constitution, the General Assembly?

MR. CLAGETT: Yes.
