THE CHAIRMAN: Let me ask you, because I personally would go along with you partway, but not all the way. Are you using charter simply as a better term than instrument of government, or are you using it as something to preclude County Commissioner form of government, for instance?

MRS. FREEDLANDER: Not to preclude. You could have a County Commissioner if it is within the charter, and if this is what the people want, if they want County Commissioner.

THE CHAIRMAN: Wouldn't it be better then to say instead of the phrase, instrument of government, something like, charter, or other form of government?

MRS. FREEDLANDER: Charter is not a form.

Charter is the framework as a Constitution is a framework. You could have a form that would be an executive type government, cabinet type government like the British or parliamentary form, you could have a presidential form. The form is what you decide as a people. Framework is your charter, is your Constitution, is your By-laws or call it what you will.
