1 allow them; a lapse of four years, to allow any form 2 government they want. What we are saying is, they must 3 have a framework. They can't go without a framework. The form can be whatever the County wants. 5 THE CHAIRMAN: Further discussion, Judge Adkins? 7 JUDGE ADKINS: I would think the term, charter, 8 9 10

properly interpreted after adoption of this Constitution would necessarily, in view of the history, mean a charter adopted pursuant to Article 11(a), whatever it is of the Maryland Constitution, as it existed prior to the adoption of this Constitution and would not have, would not be a generic work. It is a specific word of art in terms of modern, in terms of current Maryland thinking, relating to a specific type of document adopted pursuant to a specific provision of the existing Constitution. I think if you use the term charter, there is danger that it will be so interpreted. If you mean a broader concept as I do, and as I believe the Chairman has indicated, involving not only a charter but also a Commissioner
