A

word should not be used, but we perhaps should use a new word, instrument of government.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Clagett?

MR. CLAGETT: I am not going to repeat what I have already said because I think what I said was clearly understood by everybody. I only add that I am completely appreciative of the integrity of the thinking of Mrs. Freedlander, but I am sincerely afraid that it is not practical insofar as the problem which Prince Georges County and other Counties which have not followed the charter form of government have run into, and there is no reason to allow the monster to be resurrected, which could defeat the whole purpose of what we are trying to accomplish here.

THE CHAIRMAN: Dr. Winslow?

DR. WINSLOW: May I suggest a possible alternative to all of these, instead of saying an instrument of government or saying charter, merely say, may enact the basic law. There is no misunderstanding that. It doesn't necessarily mean the kind of charter other Counties have had. It is merely a basic law. It is as if
