with the answer?

MR. SAYRE: I would like to have it explained to me, how we can know in advance that we have those powers by this wording.

THE CHAIRMAN: I don't know that this wording is the wording that gives you the powers. You will have to restate your question because I don't think we follow it. The powers of the County are covered by Section 11.03

MR. SAYRE: Yes, but if the powers of those Counties are not granted by an instrument of government they don't have them. That is what worries me.

MR. CLAGETT: Mr. Chairman, let me explain.

The powers are granted by the Constitution itself and the Counties have those powers upon the effective date of the Constitution. With those powers, already granted by the constitutional instrument, the structure is merely the manner in which the County will exercise those powers, and that is why I answered the question in the affirmative. The two dovetail, I think, in a way that when you read the whole instrument, after we have adopted this amendment, so that there should be no question about
