General Assembly to come up with an instrument that does indeed grant powers.

THE CHAIRMAN: The instrument wouldn't grant the powers, Mr. Sayre. The powers are granted by the Constitution to the extent they are not taken away by the Legislature.

MR. SAYRE: That is right. I am just thinking if the Legislature fell short on that instrument, from what other charter governments --

THE CHAIRMAN: What instrument?

MR. SAYRE: That the General Assembly said you have to accept four years hence, in other words, four years have passed. You have had your change. You haven't done anything. Now, what is the instrument the General Assembly has come up with? Suppose that instrument is inadequate?

JUDGE ADKINS: It would be unconstitutional,
Mr. Sayre, if it withheld from the Counties any powers
which this Constitution by other Articles delegated to
them. It could not, for example, have within it a provision that the Counties falling within the purview of
