the plan which they adopt shall not have the power to

tax, for example, to use an extreme situation, because

this would be unconstitutional in view of other provisions

of this act.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Sayre, let me make this comment. I believe I have a glimmer of what you are driving at. Under the present Constitution, you have powers granted either by a charter or by the Express Powers Act. Under this Constitution you will have neither the charter will not grant powers. There will be no Express Powers Act.

MR. SAYRE: Right.

THE CHAIRMAN: The charter, if it speaks on powers, will do so only as a Constitution, to say that such and such a power be not exercised or shall be exercised with certain limitations. Therefore, if a charter is adopted, presumably it will not contain a list of powers to be exercised by the County. It will not authorize the County to tax. The County will have that power.
