	of government or a charter or they don't have that
2	charter.

THE CHAIRMAN: Then, do you mean to say that Baltimore County as a chartered government shall have the broad powers spelled out in the Constitution regardless of any -- no, it would still be subject to the limitations in the charter.

MR. CLACETT: Yes, sir, but instead of having express powers or the powers provided by Article 23(a), it would have the broad grant of power which would be all of those, plus any others that the Legislature had failed to give them and which would fall into the broad grant of powers.

MR. BROOKS: That is under, really, 11.03(a), that they have that power, rather than 11.04.

MR. CLAGETT: 11.04 wouldn't affect Baltimore County, because it is contemplated here in 11.04 to take care of those Counties which have no adequate structure or instrument of government to take care of the exercise of the powers under 11.03.
