you are referring to, Mr. Eney, is what in this Section on structure applies to the existing charter government; is that correct?

THE CHAIRMAN: That is right.

MR. CLAGETT: I find you in the same category that Phil Sayre was in a little while ago. We are dealing with something entirely different here. The powers are already there. This is merely the structure to exercise those powers, and where that structure is already existent, it would not require any action by the County, such as Baltimore County, except where it might desire to amend its existing charter to more adequately take care of what it wants to do in the exercise of 11.03(a).

THE CHAIRMAN: Mrs. Bothe?

MRS. BOTHE: What is the status of local legislation during this four-year period as applied to Counties which haven't yet adopted charter or are waiting out the four years to take on the State's proposal.
