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and sounded good.

THE CHAIRMAN: Dr. Winslow.

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DR. WINSLOW: Is it the intent of this article to restrict the General Assembly to those purposes enunciated by the Governor? JUDGE ADKINS: I might speak to that, Mr.

Chairman. Our original draft so provided, Doctor. It so provided until such time as we saw the Commission's action with regard to the continuing session. Frankly, some of us, without very much research on the problem, felt that if there was a continuing session concept, the Governor could not prescribe measures to be acted on under special call, since if the Legislature convened at his call they would still be a completely plenary body and have all the rights that theywould have otherwise, so it would be a nullity. That is the reason we dropped it. We preferred that concept. We dropped it in view of the action of the Commission on the recommendation of the Legislature Department.

MR. MILLER: I think that is sound.
