

1 THE CHAIRMAN: Adopts a new instrument of
2 government then.

3 MRS. FREEDLANDER: A new instrument of govern-
4 ment.

5 THE CHAIRMAN: Mrs. Bothe?

6 MRS. BOTHE: I don't see the need for the
7 whole paragraph. The powers are there. They are im-
8 mediately conferable at the time the Constitution is
9 passed. If the County doesn't have a structure to proceed
10 with them, it is going to have to find ^{it} somehow, apparently.

11 THE CHAIRMAN: The necessity for it is
12 simply this, it seems to me. The whole structure of
13 County Commissioner form of government is spelled out
14 in statutes. They are going to die when the Constitution
15 dies, so that unless we have something that affirmatively
16 continues these governments, until the new one is
17 adopted, it seems to me you have nothing.

18 MRS. BOTHE: You don't have anything anyway,
19 necessarily. You conferred powers.

20 THE CHAIRMAN: Why don't you have anything?

21 MRS. BOTHE: You have forms of County govern-
