JUDGE ADKINS: I had that originally. The Chair feels it is redundant. I now agree. What we are really trying to draw here is a grandfather clause.

MR. BROOKS: That is the schedule provision.

JUDGE ADKINS: If you are going to put it in the Constitution, doesn't what I propose do it?

THE CHAIRMAN: It does it better for me. I don't know about the others. It is limited to the existing government as a structure of government.

JUDGE ADKINS: You don't get involved as to whether it is a County Commission, Code or anything else.

DR. BARD: I would like to add if inherent within it is the fact that Baltimore City's present government is to be interpreted as a County government under that so-called statement, because the way it reads, it applies to the present, and presently we are not yet called a County government. I suspect that would be inherent, but I would like for it to get in the minutes.

MR. CLAGETT: Let me see this now. How about this: The existing County government shall have those powers provided in the Constitution.
