is that as long as ll (e) doesn't exist, for example, you will no longer have four classifications in terms of municipal corporations. Isn't that true?

MR. BROOKS: That is true.

DR. BARD: Therefore since 11 (e) does not exist, everything that is now embodied in 11 (e), it seems to me that whether the County actually moves forward in creating municipal corporations or not is another matter, but provision for it should be there, I would think.

MR. BROOKS: Except that even under the present 11 (e) and all of the constitutional provisions relating to municipal corporations, there is nevertheless on the statutes a provision which gives the Counties at the present veto power over the creation of any Counties, so it is still optional.

DR. BARD: The veto power is all right. I don't object to that, but the mere fact there would be no way by which they could be created.
