Mr. Gentry?

MR. GENTRY: The second sentence of 11.05, providing the dissolution, without either its consent or the consent of the General Assembly, what do you mean by its consent, the City Council or the voters of the City?

MR. BROOKS: City Council.

MR. CLACETT: I would say City Council would be the answer, and that is what is meant here. I believe I had better rephrase that more accurately, by the consent of its governing body.

MR. GENTRY: Not voters, not petition?
MR. CLAGETT: No.

DR. BURDETTE: This leads me to a broader question. I should think the answer is there that, its, is the process provided in its charter, which permits dissolution, and since it is highly likely that there is no such process, and I should think if there is one, it would have to be followed, and it would be illegal not to follow it, but otherwise, if it is silent, I should see no objection to its governing body.
