11 (e) gives to municipal corporations?

DR. BURDETTE: To draw their own charters and to emend them as they see fit at any time under the Express Powers Act; that is, emending of structure of the government is not controlled by the Express Powers Act.

THE CHAIRMAN: No. That is what 11 (e) is, and in answering the earlier question, I was supposing that the second sentence of 11.05 was referring only to existing powers in the charter, and that it was not providing for the continuance of any part of Article 11 (e), so as to confer new powers on the municipal corporation without consent of the County.

DR. BURDETTE: You may be right, but if the word existing is to be construed as powers that they now have, of course they have the powers in the charter because they have the power to change the charter.

THE CHAIRMAN: I think the Committee intended only the charter powers, but let me ask them. Is this what the Committee intended, Mr. Clagett, that the municipal corporations should continue to have the powers presently existing under its charter?
