MR. CLAGETT: Yes, that is what we meant, but what I am thinking is that, I am trying to reconcile that answer with the thought that the Committee also had, and that is that if the municipalities wanted to exercise a new power of some kind, they would have to get the power from the Counties.

THE CHAIRMAN: Precisely, so that the phrase, existing powers in the second sentence, refers to existing powers conferred by the charter of the municipal corporation.

MR. CLACETT: Suppose they wanted to amend their charter and exercise an existing power to amend, to utilize a new power, which was in Article 23 (a), or in 11 (e). They would then have to go to the County to get that power to amend, but I am confused in my thinking at the moment by the exercise of an existing power in the charter to amend.

THE CHAIRMAN: Dr. Bard?

DR. BARD: Under 11 (e), Section 3, it reads as follows: Any such municipal corporation existing or hereafter created shall have the power and authority to
