1	MR. CLAGETT: To, the consent of its govern-
2	ing body.
3	THE CHAIRMAN: Is there a second?
4	MRS. FREEDLANDER: Second.
5	THE CHAIRMAN: Do you have anything further to
6	say on the motion, Mr. Clagett?
7	MR. CLAGETT: No, sir. I think it is clear.
8	THE CHAIRMAN: Senator Hoff?
9	MR. HOFF: I still can't see the argument
10	that we should remove from the municipalities the powers
11	which they have today. I see no necessity for it.
12	THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Bond?
13	MR. BOND: I would like to ask a question
14	right on that point: If a municipality within its
15	charter today has the power to amend its charter in order
16	to take care of changing situations, doesn't the language
17	as proposed by Mr. Clagett not straitjacket the municipal-
18	ities, because they have the existing power to amend,
19	and they can keep on emending in order to meet changing
20	situations?
21	THE CHAIRMAN: I don't think the language would
