MR. HAILE: A County can be dissolved by threefifths vote whether it wants to or not.

MR. SCANLAN: There are really three points of view called up by this particular amendment: The phrase, existing powers set forth in the charters, they can't be taken from them without their consent, or the consent of the General Assembly, would mean merely they can keep what they now have in their charters. That doesn't go far enough for Dr. Burdette. He wants them to keep their power that they would have under 23 (2) in effect. Senator Hoff would go even further and as you to new municipalities,/would not want them to be restricted?

MR. HOFF: I did not bring in the question of new municipalities. Dr. Burdette and I stand on the same ground.

MR. SCANLAN: If you adopted Senator Hoff's idea, you would have the situation wherein the future a County might create a very large municipality like, say, the City of Silver Spring might decide to become a municipality with 160,000 people. That municipality
