

1 overriding power of the General Assembly to withdraw
2 powers from the County.

3 MR. CLAGETT: That is true.

4 THE CHAIRMAN: When you say, may delegate
5 powers to them, you mean may delegate powers of the
6 County?

7 MR. CLAGETT: Delegate powers of the County
8 to them.

9 THE CHAIRMAN: Or --

10 MR. CLAGETT: I would have no objection to in-
11 serting, and may delegate powers of the County to them.

12 THE CHAIRMAN: Any objection?

13 MR. GENTRY: You haven't got anything else
14 to delegate.

15 MR. CLAGETT: I would think so. If there is
16 any question, that is what we mean. You might delegate
17 it, but the delegation might not be any good.

18 THE CHAIRMAN: It still doesn't quite meet
19 the problem in my mind. Suppose there is a delegation of
20 power and the General Assembly later withdraws the area
21 of the exercise of that power from all Counties. Does
