THE CHAIRMAN: Would you, would the Committee intend that the cost of the administration of Baltimore City Police Department be a State expense?

MR. BROOKS: That was one, if required or established by the State, that was one of the things that was discussed last time as one of the things that would be desirable for the State to pay for if the State were going to require it.

THE CHAIRMAN: The State does provide for it.

MR. CLAGETT: If the State wants to pay for it, they can leave it to Baltimore City and stay out of it which they ought to.

DR. BURDETTE: Didn't I understand you to say,
make the State pay for municipal courts? Haven't we
already provided for that by the provision that the County
shall have no assessing power?
