and at least a substantial number of persons as to whom
we would not make that statement.

This poses a problem, because the sheer force of numbers, and the resultant dispersal of the total vote among a large number increases the possibility that a person supported by little other than a determined group of people, will be elected.

I have talked to a number of people in influential and political matters, without getting from anybody what seems to be a surefire answer. I suggest that all of you consider Countywide, district election and a mixture of both. That is, a mixture of Countywide and district, so that in a given County you might have a certain number elected Countywide and a certain number by districts. The situation in Baltimore City is even further complicated, but it might lend itself to something of that sort.

In addition, I think that all of you are probably receiving inquiries from persons interested in running for election, asking what steps are being taken to encourage people to run, et cetera. We have at the
